





In July 2010, Ridgecrest Regional Hospital became one of the first hospitals in California to receive accreditation from Det Norske Veritas (DNV) Healthcare, Inc. As a result of receiving this accreditation, RRH may continue receiving funding from the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services.



CAP ACCREDITATION

In June 2011, Ridgecrest Regional Hospital received CAP accreditation. Designed to go well beyond regulatory compliance, the program helps laboratories achieve the highest standards of excellence to positively impact patient care.


Dr. Hughes saw over 260 new patients in 2018 for oncology and hematology services. 130 of these patients were new oncology consultations for RRH.

HOSPITALS ARE REQUIRED TO RE-QUALIFY AND DEMONSTRATE THEIR COMPETENCY EVERY TWO YEARS.

A Level IV Trauma Center has demonstrated an ability to provide advanced trauma life support (ATLS) prior to transfer of patients to a higher level trauma center. It provides evaluation, stabilization, and diagnostic capabilities for injured patients.

The spine clinic will focus on patient evaluation and treatment, with collaboration and coordination at Keck Hospital of USC for surgical services, should these services be required

CANCER CENTER QUALITY METRICS

Quality metrics were used in 2018 to analyze the Cancer Center's effectiveness of treating symptoms caused by cancer treatment.

We also tracked the amount of patient calls we received after hours to make sure that we were providing the highest level of education and instructions prior to treatment.

Both of these quality metrics were completed in 2018 and results were favorable that we provided a high level of service in both areas. We have added a new quality metric to the study for 2019.


BE THE MATCH

DISCOUNTED SCREENINGS FOR PREVENTIVE CARE

The Cancer Center, in collaboration with the Radiology and Laboratory Departments, offered discounted mammograms and PSA testing to increase screening for prostate and breast cancer.

2,815 mammograms were performed in 2018 at RRH.









RRH HUMAN RESOURCES ANGEL TREE PROGRAM

Every year, the RRH HR team coordinates the The Angel Tree program, which provides gifts to RRH employee families through the generous donations of individual employees at our hospital. 46 gifts were donated by employees.



TOWARDS EMPLOYEE EDUCATION AND TRAVEL

In 2018, RRH employees received \$364,896 in scholarship monies that are used for education and travel purposes.

FOOD BASKET DONATION TO RRH EMPLOYEE FAMILIES

RRH employees put together Holiday Food Baskets for their coworkers, who were in need of a little extra help. 39 baskets were handed out to RRH employees and their families.





MONTHLY MASSAGES ARE OFFERED TO STAFF FOR FREE

A massage therapist comes on-site and provides 15 minute massages.



FREE HEALTH SCREENINGS FOR RRH EMPLOYEES

Free health screenings are offered each year to every employee. The screenings include over 20 different tests including: iron, glucose, potassium, thyroid, lipid panel and complete blood count. Prostate cancer test (PSA) and Ovarian cancer test (CA-125) are also offered.

ENCOURAGING EMPLOYEES TO STAY PHYSICALLY ACTIVE

Annual step challenge provided to employees and their family to encourage movement and increasing physical activity. Over the course of the challenge during 2018 players took a total of 21,184,712 steps, which calculates out to 10,592.36 miles.

2018 ANNUAL HEALTH FAIR

RRH is proud to host an annual Health Fair that is free to our community and provides affordable preventive health screenings. In 2018, over 40 health and wellness vendors participated.

Over 300 reduced price screenings were conducted, as well as 30 free screenings.



FUN WITH FOOD PROGRAM

The Fun with Food class had 15 students, age 7-12 years old, who learned about nutrition and also learned how to cook and bake healthy items.

The Fun with Food Advanced class had 10 students, age 9-14 years old, who learned about nutrition, food safety and proper cooking technique.



2018 RELAY FOR LIFE PARTICIPATION

Every year, RRH participates in the local Relay for Life to provide general cancer related education and to earn money for research for the American Cancer Society. In 2018, the RRH team consisted of 40 members and sponsored \$10,000 to the event.





JOURNEY TO HAPPINESS SENIORS GROUP

This seniors group meets on a weekly basis and provides a chance for seniors to come together on a journey of maintaining happiness and joy, building friendships, and embracing change all in an encouraging and uplifting environment. In 2018, the Journey to Happiness group held over 20 meetings with a total of nearly 50 participants.



FITNESS OPPORTUNITIES FOR SENIORS

RRH offers 16 exercise classes each week for free to seniors 60 years and older. These include the Silver Sneakers program and Senior Gentle Yoga. Nearly 800 classes were conducted in 2018.

NEW! ROCK STEADY BOXING PROGRAM

In 2018 RRH introduced Rock Steady Boxing - a nationwide program that utilizes non-contact boxing inspired exercise to help those with Parkinson's disease. The classes focus on balance, hand-eye coordination, speed of movement, agility, muscle power and mental focus. Four classes are offered each week with on average 20 individuals participating each week.

When I read our Mission Statement I reflect on just how much the Foundation has accomplished, not only in recent months and in 2018, but over the course of its inception.

On behalf of the Ridgecrest Regional Hospital Foundation, I wish to thank each and every one of you for making this happen. Without the continued generosity of this community and our local businesses we could not have accomplished the tremendous success we have already witnessed nor could



we be nearing our goal of purchasing a hospice home. Over the past few years the Foundation has not only assisted in the purchase of large equipment for the hospital, but we have also provided gas cards to cancer patients to assist them in the ongoing costs of traveling to and from their out-of-town appointments. The support of our senior community through their donations made it possible to replace flooring in the Silver Sneakers facility. And these are just a few examples of our accomplishments.

In regards to the hospice home, we are now two-thirds of the way to our goal of \$300,000.00 and we are confident that by the end of 2019 that goal will have been met – making the dream become a reality. In 2018 alone \$124,863.00 was raised for the home.

2018 also saw the re-launch of Women in Philanthropy and we are proud to say it is now 24 members strong and growing. This group of dedicated women not only provide financial support to the Foundation, they also provide their leadership skills and have become ambassadors for the Foundation. In December they hosted their first annual Christmas Tree Village creating a fun event for the hospital. The event alone generated over \$3,000 in donations for the Foundation.

The Butterfly Boutique continues to grow and prosper providing financial support to RRH Hospice Services. This amazing little boutique is run solely by volunteers with the exception of the boutique manager.

As the Foundation grows and supports the hospital, I cannot thank you enough for the very generous manner in which our community has assisted in this ongoing growth.

As I have said before, we are so very fortunate to live in a community that is large enough to make a difference, yet small enough that we can all see just what a difference we are making. I cannot wait to see what we accomplish in 2019.


